Celebration of Hope Coming to Grand Falls–Windsor November 5 & 6. This is an evangelistic partnership between the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association and local churches. The 9-month celebration journey in Grand Falls-Windsor includes discipleship and evangelism training phases and community outreach projects. The Celebration culminates with two nights of powerful outreach events *November 5-6.* It will take place at the Joe Byrne Stadium. Doors open on Saturday November 5 at 6 p.m. The following groups will be featured: *The City Harmonic; Manifest; The Color.* On Sunday, November 6, the doors open at 5 p.m. and will feature *Jason Crabb* and *The Color.* On both nights, Will Graham, son of Franklin Graham and grandson of Billy Graham, will be sharing a message of hope. Will is the third generation of Grahams to proclaim the gospel of Jesus Christ under the banner of the Bill Graham Evangelistic Association. No tickets will be sold and admission is free. It is for people of all denominations or no denomination at all. Holy Trinity has been part of the planning of this event for the past year.

PWRDF Launches Appeal for Haiti. Again, the very impoverished country of Haiti was hit viciously hard by Hurricane Matthew recently. Many lives were lost and homes destroyed. Shortage of food, clean water, and sanitary conditions threaten to claim even more lives. Cholera is a very real danger there at this time as conditions are extremely unhealthy. The Anglican Church of Canada, through PWRDF, is asking for donations to support the people of Haiti as they attempt to cope with the aftermath of the hurricane. Matthew was the most powerful storm to hit the island nation in almost 10 years. It brought torrential rains and winds of close to 220 km/h to a Haiti still recovering from the catastrophic earthquake of 2010. About 60,000 people were still living in tents or other makeshift homes as a result of the earthquake. More than 1000 people have already died and that number is likely to go higher. PWRDF initially announced a grant of \$15,000 for Haiti on October 4, the day the hurricane struck. The money, with further generous donations from Anglicans across Canada, will provide food, medical aid, shelter, clean water and other assistance to Haitians. If you would like to help, simply place our donation in a plain envelope. Mark it *Relief For Haiti*, and it will be forwarded to PWRDF.

James 5:16 is often used when people are gathered together to pray for healing, as it states to “pray for each other that you might be healed.” Peter 2:24 and Isaiah 53:4-5 both state that through Jesus’ death on the cross, healing is received: “by his wounds you are healed.” Although many verses are used to pray for physical healing, other verses refer to emotional healing. Psalm 147:3 states, “He heals the broken-hearted and binds up their wounds.” Other passages from Psalms used for spiritual and emotional encouragement are 30:2 and 107:19-21.
