**Welcome.** We welcome everyone to our worship. If this is your first time at Holy Trinity, please introduce yourself to our Greeters and Clergy and sign our guest book in the foyer.

**Happy Mother's Day.** Mother's Day is a special time of the year. On this Mother's Day, let us be thankful for the love that can be found and experienced in the persons that we call *Mother* and *Grandmother*.

**History of Mother's Day.** The modern celebration of Mother's Day was first celebrated in 1908, when Anna Jarvis held a memorial for her mother in Grafton, West Virginia. Her mother, Ann Jarvis, had previously founded Mother's Day Work Clubs in five cities across the US to improve sanitary and health conditions for working men and women. After Ann died, her daughter held a memorial for her and campaigned to make Mother's Day a recognised holiday. Her wish was finally granted in 1914.

However, by the 1920's Anna became very upset with how commercialized the holiday had become. She tried to have the holiday removed from the calendar, as the celebration of mothers became less important than the selling of greeting cards, flowers and chocolate. It is always celebrated on the second Sunday of May in North America, and, also has a close connection to *Mothering Sunday*, which is a holiday in some parts of the church to honor Motherhood.

**Province of Canada Elects a New Metropolitan!** With the retirement of Archbishop Percy Coffin soon, the new Archbishop elect is the Rt. Rev. Bishop Ron Cutler, Bishop of the Diocese of Nova Scotia-PEI. Bishop Cutler served as a priest in this Diocese in the parishes of Twillingate and Smith's Sound before moving to Nova Scotia. The Ecclesiastical Province of Canada is one of several provinces in the Anglican Church of Canada (not to be confused with a political province), which consists of the Dioceses of Eastern NL, Central NL, Western NL, Nova Scotia-PEI, Fredericton, Quebec and Montreal. In addition to his duties as our Metropolitan, Bishop Ron will also continue his Diocesan duties in his current Diocese. His installation will be held on a date to be determined soon.

**Sympathy.** Our condolences to Dale Butler, one of our ACW Co-Presidents, on the passing of her father, Alonzo Normore, of Springdale this past week. We join in giving thanks for his long life of 92 years, and pray God's blessings upon his family.

**Thank You.** The ACW afternoon tea and bake sale was held yesterday in the EM Bishop Hall. Thank you to all the ladies who helped out with donations of food for the tea and the bake sale. Thank you also to all who helped to prepare, serve, and clean up.

**Primate World Relief Development Fund.** The PWRDF is active in helping with the *toxic triangle of drought, hunger and conflict* affecting the African nations of South Sudan, Yemen, Somalia and Nigeria. More than 20 million people in these four nations are on the brink of starvation and famine, according to the United Nations. This is the largest humanitarian crisis since the end of the Second World War. Our Primate, Archbishop Fred Hiltz, was recently in the news media drawing attention to the terrible situation and asking Canadians to respond to the crisis. Please continue to give generously to PWRDF (your blue envelopes) so that it can continue to offer assistance to these nations. Did you know that more than 96% of money giving to PWRDF makes it on the ground to aid those who are in need? This is the best value for your dollar. We don't know of another charity that uses less money in administration than PWRDF.
