When we are part of the baptism of a child, we all make the promise that *we will do all in our power to support this child in his/her life in Christ*. All too often we never really comprehend the magnitude of that promise we make to God. Today, let us really think about these words when we make the response in the service.

Flowers for Father's Day. If you would like to place flowers in the Church in memory of Fathers and Grandfathers, please place your gift and the names in an envelope. Please mark the envelope **Flowers for Father's Day** and place it in the Offertory Plate. The names must be in no later than next Sunday, June 11.

Choir Service Next Sunday, June 11. The Choir will be leading the worship next Sunday at 10:30 a.m. Please come along and be inspired by our choir as they do the full service.

Next Sunday, June 11 is South Sudan Sunday in our Diocese! On May 29, we were informed that all donations made to South Sudan for famine relief will be matched by the Government of Canada. We must act very fast because these funds will be matched only up to June 30. That means we have to have the monies into our Synod Office long before that in order for it to be forwarded to Primate World Relief Development Fund (PWRDF) in time to receive matching funds. Simply take a plain envelope and mark it *PWRDF South Sudan Famine Relief*, and place your donation into the Offering Plate next Sunday, June 11. That means for example that if you donate \$20 that automatically becomes \$40. We all know the plight of the people in South Sudan right now as it faces famine and drought and civil war. Bishop Francis Loyo was with us last September, and right now he is among his people in South Sudan doing whatever he can with the very limited resources of his Diocese. Our Diocese of Central Newfoundland last year entered into a Companionship relationship with South Sudan, and we are asking all of the parishes of our Diocese to support this cause, and even more importantly, to pray for the people of South Sudan, and Bishop Francis, and his Diocese of Rokon.

Learn. Pray. Act. *22 Days for Healing and Reconciliation* begin May 31 for 22 Days. The Anglican Church of Canada is calling people to learn, pray, and act for the Anglican Healing Fund and its support for the recovery of Indigenous languages. [22 Days for Healing and Reconciliation](#) start on May 31 and lead up to the National Aboriginal Day of Prayer on June 21. Anglicans are encouraged to mark 22 Days by learning about the Healing Fund and its role in bolstering community-based projects to preserve Indigenous languages; praying for those who seek healing through language recovery and acting to support the Healing Fund through prayer and donations.
