**Lent Is Drawing Near.** The purpose of Lent is to prepare us for the celebration of the death and resurrection of Christ. To help us prepare for the celebration of Easter, we invite you to journey with us in a 10-service *Christ on Trial* series for Lent, Holy Week, and Easter. Parishioners will listen in each week as court is in session to determine who Christ is. Each service includes a drama with a lawyer alone or with a witness, a commentary, may include a children’s sermon, prayers and hymns. Scriptural evidence is analyzed at each service, and eye witnesses share accounts of their encounters with Jesus. We will begin with our Ash Wednesday service on February 14 at 7:30 p.m.
