Freedom of the Will

We remember how Jesus said, "...I have finished the work which thou gavest me to do" (John 17:4). That statement reveals that God had a definite plan for Jesus' life, that Jesus could and did know what that plan was, and that it was possible for Him to accomplish it. That was true for Christ; it is also true for each one of us. No one of us is here by accident nor by chance. God has a plan for your life—of that you can be sure.

However, God gave to each person power of choice and freedom of will. We remember how our Lord prayed, "nevertheless not my will, but thine be done" (Luke 22:42). The prayer teaches two very important truths: first, one might have a will for his own life that is contrary to God's will for him. Second, it is possible to follow your own will and turn your back on God's will for you. Were those two facts not true, then Christ's prayer would have been mockery.
