Greetings. It is indeed a pleasure to welcome you this morning. May Christ's Spirit and love be with you as we worship this morning. If this is your first time, please take a moment following the service to sign our guest book located in the foyer.

Trinity Season. The Trinity Season is the longest season of the church year, starting today, the Sunday after Pentecost and ending at Advent. It celebrates the Christian doctrine of the Trinity – God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit!

Today is Trinity Sunday. Last Sunday we celebrated Pentecost Sunday to honor the coming of the Holy Spirit into the world. Pentecost is often referred to as the "birth of the Christian Church." Today, we celebrate the feast day of our congregation, and the great love God has for us and the world, as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It reminds us how we, as Christians, should respond to the love God has shown us by telling others about Him through our actions and words, praising Him and giving Him glory. We remember the Father as our Creator, the Son as our Savior, and the Holy Spirit as our Comforter.

Food Bank Sunday. Next Sunday is Food Bank Sunday. Food Banks are always in need of non-perishable items. Please bring along a few items next Sunday to assist the Food Bank. You may place your items in the Food Bank Box in the foyer.

Church Bulletins in Memoriam. A new chart is now available. Anyone wishing to donate a bulletin for a particular Sunday may do so by entering the details on the chart located in the main foyer. Should you wish healing prayer for yourself or for another or to offer a prayer of thanksgiving, you are invited to come to the prayer station during Communion.
